## Spring Mountain Ranch HOA "Wildfire Fuel Reduction Community Preparedness Project" May 6th - May 24th

Hello Spring Mountain Ranch HOA members,

Happy Spring! As we are starting to see the snow melt fast, it is time to start planning some clean up from old man winter and his windy sidekick. The snow and wind this season did some natural pruning all around the neighborhood. Removing dead vegetation around your cabin is one of the most effective ways you can reduce wildfire risk. If you have some woody debris to clean up, the HOA is setting up the neighborhood yard waste bin May 6 -24.

For the second consecutive season, the SMR HOA Firewise Committee applied for and won a National Fire Protection Association \$500 Wildfire Preparedness Day Grant towards wildfire fuel clean-up. We will be utilizing that grant money to help subsidize the annual SMR HOA woody debris collection bin program.

- May 28 June 9: There will be free collection bins located across from the McCall Fire Department on Deinhard Lane

Reminders about the use of the HOA yard waste bin -

- Use the bin to dispose of any woody debris including dead vegetation, clippings, branches, leaves, needles, etc.
  - Do not put debris in plastic bags, and please, do not use the bin to dispose of any non-woody debris from your property.
     We will be fined or the bin will be rejected and the HOA will pay extra.
  - Let us know if you see any issues...a community watch program helps.
  - When the bin is full, we will arrange to have it emptied and replaced. Please do not overfill the bin as it has to be covered in order to transport/empty it. If it's full, please wait for the next one.
